

230K-Volt Power Transmission Line and 10-Acre Electrical Substation Coming to the Hamilton Mill Area

Georgia Transmission Corp. (Jackson EMC) plans to construct a 230K-volt power transmission line (with 100-foot-tall towers) and a 10-acre electrical substation in your neighborhood. We're asking for just an hour or two of your time to help persuade Jackson EMC to accept obvious alternatives.

The transmission line abruptly leaves the GA 324 (Auburn Rd.) corridor near the park boundary and will cut a 125-foot swath of bare land through the hardwood forest in Little Mulberry Park to the location of the 10-acre substation on Jim Moore Road.

Clearly, **there are options** for keeping the line on the GA 324 corridor and putting the substation in a commercial setting rather than in the middle of the Hamilton Mill residences. This location would also avoid the destruction and permanent damage to a passive greenspace park that many believe to be the most beautiful setting in Gwinnett County – and the envy of everyone in the state.

If you're concerned about:

- Reduction in your property values
- Irrevocable damage to Little Mulberry Park...

... please **attend the public meetings** that are being held to give you **the only opportunity to voice your opinion**. Come to the meetings and let Jackson EMC know that this project needs to stay on the GA 324 corridor – again, a commercial tract – rather than intrude on Little Mulberry Park and Hamilton Mill greenspace.

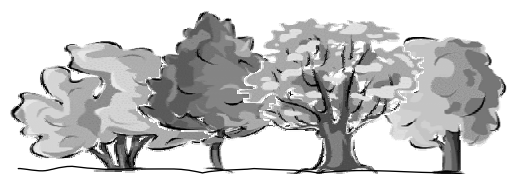
